• Student Showcase: Elementary STEM

Dr. Gallagher then introduced Ms. Tursi to present the "Elementary STEM Program" presentation. Student presenters were Blythe and Seager Aull – Robotics, Coding and Engineering; Waverly and Summer Schaffer – Balloons Over Broadway; Josh Moreno – March Madness; and Paxton, Presley and Phoenix Cavallo – STEAM Night. Elementary STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) teachers: Ms. Gallo, Mr. Jones, Ms. Nicholls and Ms. Rundo. Dr. Gallagher thanked the student presenters and teachers. Mr. Pinto also thanked everyone, especially Ms. Rundo, adding that he has two of those projects at home, and the kids really love playing with them; Mrs. Conway also thanked the teachers and presenters.

Presentation: Budget and Bond Proposals – Central Administration Support Services

Dr. Gallagher then introduced Mr. DeVito to present on the Central Administration support functions. Mr. DeVito started by explaining that Central Support pertains to the Board of Education, the District Clerk, Legal Services, Records Management, Facilities, Central Printing, Insurance and BOCES. He stated further that the proposed budget includes a 13% insurance premium increase, BoardDocs software, electronic signature books for the annual election and contractual salary increases, as well as a 2%-3% increase in BOCES costs. The proposed Operations budget includes funding for overtime and per diem subs, a 5% price escalation increase for natural gas and electricity, along with an increase in recurring operational and maintenance costs based on building needs.

# III. President Ryan called for Board of Education Comments

**BOE Comments** 

- Dr. Ryan asked if the district was sufficiently covered with cyber insurance and Mr.
  DeVito replied yes. Dr. Ryan asked, regarding legal services, how often we have to
  go out to bid, and Mr. DeVito replied that there is no requirement to go out to bid
  for legal services; only a requirement to obtain a Request for Proposal for the
  external auditor every five years.
- Dr. Ryan asked, in terms of the Bond vote, in light of drastic cuts in State aid, what is the recommendation with regard to moving forward, and Mr. DeVito replied that he recommends waiting until next year. Dr. Ryan stated that he supports that recommendation and asked for a consensus among the Board.
- Mrs. Conway asked if a 2-3% increase in BOCES costs is unusual and Mr. DeVito replied no, it is typical. She also asked about the insurance increases, and Mr. DeVito replied that the increase is a function of all of the insurance claims filed and high jury awards. Mrs. Conway stated that she also supports Mr. DeVito's recommendation to wait on the Bond vote.
- Board Vice President Pinto glad to hear finally getting rid of temporary boiler, and also supports Mr. DeVito's recommendation to wait on the Bond vote.
- Ms. Pace and Ms. Bellsey also support the recommendation to wait on the Bond vote.
