#### Transportation Discussion

Mr. DeVito recommended one (1) alternate stop per student; extension from June 1 to July 15; October 15 final changes. The law prohibits the school district from taking any child to anything but childcare/day care.

#### **Public Comments**

- Frank Conrad- 38 Heron St asked for the basis of the legal decision (Commission of Education – 2 decisions)
- Tina Hummel 600 Shore Rd asked about childcare facility distinction.
- Joanne Rea LBSEA President as a driver questioned the drop off at Temple Emanu-El which serves as both a childcare facility and a place of religious instruction.
- Michele Fitzpatrick 416 W. Penn St asked if other districts like Hewlett-Woodmere and Lawrence made any distinctions (yes)

#### Transportation Discussion (continued)

Mr. DeVito acknowledged a subset of twenty (20) students who attend Holy Trinity outside the fifteen (15) mile radius. Joseph Lilly, school attorney, explained that transportation could be

provided by a central stop; he looked for guidance for an extension on the 15 mile rule but the only other option is by voter approval in a non-city school district which does NOT apply to Long Beach. Using Transfinder, the district was able to accommodate all but twenty (20) students.

#### **Public Comments**

- Joe Perchinelli 29 Fairway Rd requested a look at Transfinder; asked if transportation will cease without anchor student (3 year span); voiced concerns about students crossing Lido Blvd. and Park Ave with central location.
- Patricia McCluney 109 Franklin Blvd expressed her belief that this was simply a costcutting measure (it does not cut costs); feels parochial students being targeted; supervisor will be needed; this has been done for the past fifteen (15) years; requested location of list of schools.
- Frank Conrad 38 Heron St as an attorney and judge for the past fifty (50) years, suggested asking for litigation; guidance from state ed is not law; approach state ed and ask for exception; parent of Holy Trinity students should not be penalized for living on an island which is far away from everything; need to take working mothers into account.

Board Members continued the discussion with the attorney reiterating that it is the law. Also noted was that many schools are close to the fifteen (15) miles and requests are rejected

 Dave Daminao – 453 W. Beech St – we understand the issue; know there is no savings and that there will be additional costs; grandfather in court of law; join us in working with T. Kaminsky and M. Miller (they have already been spoken to).

President Mininsky called for a motion to provide only one alternative bus stop with an initial extension from June 1 to July 15 with no changes until October 15.

- Ellen Perchinelli 29 Fairway Rd explained that Holy Trinity has a robust resource room serving the underserved; we pay our school taxes (nurses, special education services, textbooks paid by taxes); law could be arbitrary; how long would it take to fix this legislatively.
- Hinda Mizrahi 215 E. Beech St we have been turned down to many schools for the fifteen (15) mile rule so it is not limited to Holy Trinity students; drivers should do at least two (2) runs prior to start of schools; cameras needed for bullying on buses (all buses should have cameras); buses sometimes come thirty (30) minutes late; LB never gets to school on time; routes are better but there are five (5) schools on one (1) bus and others are one (1) to one (1); more efficiency needed.
- Christine Maflin 512 W. Market St voiced concerns about crossing the street; asked what changed; afraid children will get hurt.

# IX. President Mininsky called for Questions and Comments from the Public.

**Public Comment** 

- Sharon Powers and Jackie Miller CCPTA Co-Presidents asked about IB Program; \$30,000 for 70 students, 7 mentors for IB; IB Coordinator (70% of students are involved in IB); questioned the hiring of qualified person.
- Patty Arroyo 321 E. Fulton St alarmed about no homework policy; district is too easy on students; reading is good but homework is necessary to learn responsibility, too.
- Melissa Moss 512 E. Bay Drive some elementary traditional assignments are ok; voice concerns over MS/HS grading; the two grade policy per quarter of one for academics and one for behavior; responsibility and accountability important; supports Regents grading; consider 60/40 for academics/behavior; no incentive if not held accountable.
- Tony Pasiano 70 Rochester host dad for foreign exchange student; got policy created through D. Weiss; most rewarding experience Marta spoke.
- Amy Rand 64 Barnes St agree with others that time management is essential, meaningful homework needs to be part of life; students will not do homework if there are no consequences; need to be more productive.
- Alexis Pace 60 E. Olive St MS letter was more alarming than the no homework policy; looking at differential in students; how will non-academic student grades be determined; how will you help students who fall behind; supports change to move forward but must consider repercussions.
- Kris K W. Olive St educator and dad, doesn't see how homework policy meshes with
  mission statements; lowering standards, meeting goals; undermines professional experience
  of teachers, weakens home to school connection, burden on teachers, APPR is a disaster;
  what is the problem you are trying to solve; will this apply to LARC.
- Laura Milone 24 Dalton St her children's experience is positive, homework is reasonable, always encouraged to read; more free play in right amounts; worries about kids who don't know how to manage time.
- Heather LoCasio 636 E. Park Ave WraP every night but what happens to math; MS behavior, not accountable, no incentive to do the work; deadlines – they won't do the work.
- Kim Fales 183 Regent Drive voiced concerns since she has two very different children; forced communication has been good for one of them; other is different.
- Carol Marchesano 515 E. Beech St have motivated child and sports teams; he will opt not to do homework with no consequences; not having details is alarming; kids will be lost without homework to keep up.
- Allison Brandt 260 Blackheath Road expects to review homework with kids when she gets home from work at 7 after working full time; how will this be measured; what if it doesn't work; more time on social media.

Dr. Gallagher explained the rationale. Emphasis on reading; math homework too different for parents; more instructional time; process will be evaluated. On secondary level, students are accountable for work; we have responsibility that a grade is a grade; multiple opportunities to demonstrate ability; negotiated late homework policy; we devalue students by assuming the worst; bottom line is we continue this conversation in September on specifics, evaluating every step of the way.

- Linda Giles 575 National Boulevard former math teacher, never believed in drills, better readers include reading for all subjects; lacrosse fields filed with goose droppings.
- Gail Rusgo-124 Audrey Drive thanks Dr. Gallagher; it is refreshing to collaborate, evaluate with parental involvement; taking risks, truly appreciate it; parents as partners.

#### X. Board of Education – Additional New/Old Business if any

 Board Member Ryan doesn't agree with Dr. Gallagher on homework issue. BOE has not created policy; it is just practice. Committee should have been public work session; pilot issue, compromise on neglect and rigor; major concerns; time is limited for experiment; arguments on both sides.
