Members of the public may address the Board of Education on any specific agenda item during special time reserved for that purpose prior to Board discussion and action. The public may also address the Board of Education on any matter of concern at a second public session after the Board of Education completes agenda action items. Visitors should not address the board in public relative to questions or comments regarding specific staff members or specific students. Such concerns should be brought to the attention of appropriate staff or to board members by telephone, in writing, or by scheduling a personal meeting, as appropriate to the circumstances.

Visitors' comments will be limited to five (5) minutes for each agenda item upon which comment is made. Visitors are precluded from speaking on any agenda item more than once during each meeting.

EDUCATIONAL NEGLECT POLICY

The Board of Education recognizes that as of August of 2006, section 34-a of Social Services Law was amended to require local social services districts, in conjunction with local school districts within its district, to develop and submit written policies and procedures regarding the reporting of educational neglect by each school district and the investigation of educational neglect by local Child Protective Services (CPS).

Section 1012 of the Family Court Act has identified a "neglected" child as one that is less than eighteen years of age whose physical, mental or emotional condition has been impaired or is in imminent danger of becoming impaired as a result of the failure of his/her parent or other person legally responsible for his/her care to exercise a minimum degree of care in supplying the child with adequate food, clothing, shelter or education, or medical, dental, optometric or surgical care, though financially able to do so. Part One of Article 65 of the New York State Educational Law provides that a child must attend full time school instruction in September if he/she turns six (6) years old on or before the first day of December of that school year; a child who becomes six (6) years old after the first of December must attend full time school instruction from the first day of session in the following September. The law further provides that a child must attend full time school instruction until the last day of session in the school year in which the minor becomes 16 years of age.

Accordingly, educational neglect is considered to be the failure of a parent/guardian to ensure their child's prompt and regular attendance in school and/or keeping their child out of school for impermissible reasons resulting in an adverse affect on the child's educational progress or an imminent danger of such adverse effect.

According to the Office of Child and Family Services, the following three elements are necessary in order for a report of educational neglect to be accepted by the Statewide Central Register for Child Abuse and Maltreatment.

1. Excessive absence from school by the child

Long Beach City School District has determined that excessive absences that would require CPS intervention would include but is not limited to a child missing 20 consecutive days of school in accordance with the districts comprehensive attendance policy. Whether or not the absences are unexcused is an issue for the CPS investigation and Long Beach City School District is not required to reach a decision as to whether the absences are excused or unexcused at the time of making a report to Child Protective Services. However, any information the school has as to whether the absences are excused or unexcused should be provided at the time of reporting.

2. Reasonable cause to suspect that the parent is aware or should have been aware of the excessive absenteeism and that the parent has contributed to the problem or is failing to take steps to effectively address the problem

Long Beach school officials should contact the parent(s) in accordance with its comprehensive attendance policy to determine the parent's awareness of the excessive absences and to offer assistance as appropriate. At least one attempt to contact the parent should be made verbally and documented. Additionally, at least one attempt should be made in writing, sent certified mail. Reasonable cause, as suggested by the Office of Child and Family Services, to suspect that a parent is aware of the absence and has not taken reasonable steps to address the problem, will be found in cases where the school advises that a parent has been unable to be contacted, has been uncooperative with school officials, or cannot provide an explanation for the child's absences, if the other criteria for educational neglect can be met.

3. Reasonable cause to suspect educational impairment or harm to the child or imminent danger of such impairment or harm

There must also be concern that the student's absences have had an adverse effect on the educational progress or are creating a danger of such an adverse effect.

If a child and his/her absences fit the criteria above, a designated representative from the Long Beach City School District will be notified to contact Child Protective Services immediately.

As per the Model Policy released to the public by the Office of Child and Family Services in or about February 2008, all school staff will be informed of the policy and procedures for reporting and investigating educational neglect.

Any policy regarding educational neglect adopted by Long Beach School District does not supersede policy adopted by Nassau County Social Services. As these policies become available, the Board of Education will revisit and make any necessary changes as per state policy and law.
