- 1. Four year employment contract averages a percentage of 2.8 %
- 2. Four major changes are:
  - Contract will limit the number of column movements in a given year
  - ➤ Teachers will pay a larger percentage of their health insurance contributions, increasing from 12% to 15% of the life of the contract
  - ➤ Limits will be set for compensation for in-service courses at an estimated savings of hundreds of thousands of dollars to the District
  - Teachers will provide an additional extra help session per week and teachers will be allowed to bring their children to our district

#### Mr. Franklin Alvarado – 613 Monroe Boulevard

- ➤ Inquired about the yearly numbers in the contract. (Mr. Venator provided the numbers: 3.1%, 2.9%, 2.75%, and 2.5%)
- ➤ Inquired about the LBCTA contract: the net value in real money, the value of the percentage in the increase in health insurance, net value of in-service compensation, and the value of MA 80

I don't have the confidence in this firm, Ingerman Smith that other board members do. My experience over the past three and a half months has been with a firm that I feel is more committed to certain staff members at the potential expense of the Board of Ed and the LBCSD. I ask my fellow board members, as a suggestion, that we hire an independent counsel to review certain items and opinions that have been given by representatives of Ingerman and Smith before they extend their contract.

#### Board Member Ryan

Just to speak out, having experience with a number of firms – only because I work in other districts – not because I'm litigious by nature, I am satisfied with the quality of service from Ingerman Smith. I do think they run the gamut in terms of whether it's Special Ed or whether its building or other kinds of legal services. I differ with Mrs. Tangney on the provision of the service. I think, in any law firm, you have strengths and weaknesses like you have in most any other area of business. But, overall, I am grateful for their service and I would certainly support their continued service in the district.

But, I felt they've always had the District as Number One in their position and I support them and I will be supporting them tonight.
