- Nancy Fleming – 561 E. Bay Drive – Garden City teacher - expressed her dissatisfaction with 9th grade honors for all and made suggestions for improvements in English curriculum.
- Zachary Levokove – 1 Saratoga Street -voiced concern about method of notifying students about the elimination of AP Bio; IB classes running with smaller numbers; asked about disqualification of AP Bio students; suggested maintaining programs with proven success.
- Mark Morgenstern – 91 Sands Court – emailed letters to Dr. Greenberg and Board - posed 4 questions regarding honors for all; assessments, Jorgensen, student survey results and JIT report.
- Darlene Haut – 205 Blackheath Road – requested copy of traffic study from fall 2010.
- Michael Brown – 67 Curley Street – asked that his 5th grade son be able to participate in APT class for 6th grade; asked about elimination of library program for 3, 4, and 5 grades.

Administration / Board of Education Additional Comments

- Dr Greenberg clarified that his intention was always to raise the bar for all; have all of our students be competitive and succeed. Introduction of IB Program, reorganization of directors, self-select; college acceptances have blossomed.
- Dr. Butera stated that IB Bio rated higher than AP Bio plus AP Bio changing next year. Initiatives need support of all to succeed; moving slowly by request of parents. Promised dialog with parents, teacher training, assessments throughout the year; program is the most analyzed; follow-up was done. Student feedback- negative - reading too easy and group project inequity – positive reaction- students felt more confident and JIT commended program.
- Dr. Passi noted that 9th grade is most watched program – addressing significant gap issues. NYSED team visited and support higher tracking for all. Meeting of 70 students and administration; 50% of students selected AP Euro next year; students addressed necessity for higher level books, cooperative learning issues. Students rise to challenge.
- Mr. Anisansel elaborated on professional development- 3 full day workshops, on-going weekly meetings.
- Board Member Lester dissatisfied with the responses concerning high achievers’ challenges.
- Dr. Ryan asked about AP Euro enrollment numbers.
- Vice President Gallagher believes in raising the bar with additional accelerated classes; reiterated his belief in the advice of bond counsel; noted extra monies expended for new counsel.
- Board Member Tangney angry that accurate assessment piece not done; fears 6th grade debacle being repeated at the HS; questioned AP Bio and AP Chem class sizes; noted student complaints of lack of rigor in instruction, questioned time frame for professional development; surprised by library pilot program at East School for 3, 4, and 5 grade, upset over literacy cuts, asked about HS pool repair timeline; asked about RFPs for legal and security contracts.
- Mr. Graham explained the process for properly placing students and disqualifying students from AP classes, including the failure of a student to pass a prerequisite course, lack of lab eligibility.
- Mr. Lester thanked Mr. Graham for his answers.
